REPORT OF THE SECRETARY-TREASURER ON THE THIRD ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF MIDWESTERN Second PARASITOLOGISTS

Ann Arbor, Michigan, June 19 & 20, 1950

Business Session, June 19: The meeting was called to order by Presiding Officer Bangham at 11:07 AM in room 1121, Natural Sciences Building.

The minutes of the meetings of June 20 and 21, 1949, prepared by

D. R. Lincicome, were read and approved.

H. J. Van Cleave reported on discussions with the council of the American Society of Parasitologists concerning the status of the Conference. The council's position is that it cannot recognize branches. Since the establishment of branches is not prohibited by the constitution of the ASP, this is taken to mean that the council does not wish to take action.

G. R. LaRue moved that the statement of organization of the Conference adopted June 21, 1949, be approved. Seconded by Porter. Modifications suggested were that certain Canadian provinces and Nebraska and Kansas be specifically included in the area. It was also suggested that the regional organization of the Society of Economic Entomologists and the Society of American Bacteriologists be studied in connection with the relationship of the Conference to the ASP. LaRue's motion was carried.

The Presiding Officer appointed the following committees to re-

port at the June 20 sessions

H. Elishewitz suggested that the Conference might sponsor a clearing house for the area on stock cultures, especially living material for teaching purposes. Levine suggested a committee to investigate the problem. The Presiding Officer appointed a committee, consisting of Elishewitz, chm., Levine and Miss Young, to report at the session of June 20. The meeting was adjourned at 11:27.

Business Session, June 20: The meeting was called to order by Presiding Officer Bangham at 9:07 AM in room 1121, Natural Sciences.

G. R. LaRue gave the report of the naminating committee, proposing L. O. Nolf for Presiding Officer. There being no further nominations, Van Cleave moved that the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Dr. Nolf. Seconded by Walton and carried.

E. E. Dickerman presented the report of the the committee on meeting place for 1951, stating that R. M. Cable had invited the Conference to Purdue and recommending that we accept. Walton moved acceptance of the invitation. Seconded by Porter and carried.

N. D. Levine reported for the membership committee, moving the addition of Kansas, Nebraska, North and South Dakota, Ontario and Manitoba to the list of states considered in the midwestern area. Seconded by Semrad. After discussion the motion was withdrawn and it was suggested that all state and province names be omitted, leaving the area undefined. No action

W. W. Cort moved that notices of meetings be sent to all members of the ASP. No action was taken.

H. Elishewitz reported for the special committee on stock cultures, suggesting that after inquiry from pertinent federal agencies concerning regulations on shipping of pathogenic agents all interested institutions be circularized. Van Cleave moved continutation of this committee. Seconded by Lincicome and carried.

A. C. Walton moved a vote of appreciation to the local committee.

A group of six went on to visit the Zoology camp on Base Line Lake.
