ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SIXTH ANNUAL MIDWESTERN CONFERENCE
OF PARASITOLOGISTS AND A REQUEST FOR DEMONSTRATIONS

The sixth Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists will be held at Michigan State College (East Lansing) during the afternoon of Monday, June 21, and the morning of Tuesday, June 22. The registration headquarters will be in Kellogg Center and the meeting rooms will be in Giltner Hall. A banquet is planned for the evening of June 21, at a cost of \$2.60 per person.

In addition to the research demonstrations, a panel discussion on Graduate programs and problems (to be conducted by graduate students) is being planned for the second day of the conference.

A map of the campus together with a reservation form are enclosed. Please fill out the latter as it is essential that we prepare an estimate of the attendance both for Kellogg Center and Giltner Hall.

Research demonstrations:

Facilities are expected to be sufficient unless we have too many requests for binocular dissecting microscopes. The number of demonstrations per person is not restricted.

There were 82 registrants and 18 demonstrations presented at this meeting. Dinner was held in the Kellogg Center with Dr. G.F. Otto as the speaker on the subject: "Mosquitoes, Worms, Samoans and the Parasitologist in Samoa." Dr. Otto illustrated his address with excellent kodachromes of the Samoan Islands.

June 21, 1954

1st. Business meeting: Held in the auditorium of Giltner Hall. Presiding Officer A.C. Walton called the meeting to order.

- a. The minutes of the last annual meeting were read and approved.
- b. There was a reading of the policy of the organization.
- c. Dr. Elishevitiz reported on the work of the cultures committee. The previous year's recommendation for that committee were to be followed.
- d. Dr. Lewert reported for the membership committee.

The presiding officer appointed Drs. Herrick, Lewert and Leland for the nominations committee.

The presiding officer appointed for the meeting place committee Drs. Hansen, Parsons and Mizelle.

Dr. Lewert reporting for the nominating committee submitted the name of Dr. R.C. Cable. Motion was made, seconded and carried to elect Dr. Cable.

Report of Meeting Place Committee by Dr. Cable. The committee received an invitation to meet at Manhattan, Kansas and this was brought to the floor for discussion. Since there was a diversity of opinion on Kansas as a meeting place a motion was made to empower the Meeting Place Committee to select and notify the membership through the Secretary of the 1955 meeting place. Motion was carried.

Dr. Walton announced a serious decrease in the demonstration program of the ASP and suggested that this group try to encourage that important function of the national society.

There was a discussion about coordination between the ASP and Midwestern group and that the Midwestern group attempt to get announcements and a brief summary of Midwestern meetings into the Journal of Parasitology.

There was a panel discussion concerning the graduate student program and problems by representative graduate students from several universities. The men on this program were: Jackson, LeZotte, Kraut, Marquardt, Cjmela and Schneider.
