Report of Secretary-Treasurer, 1958

Minutes: Ninth Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists.

80 Registrants.

Business meeting - June 17, 1957: The meeting was called to order by President Ackert at 4:20 p.m. in the Auditorium of the School of Public Health, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

The Minutes of the Eighth Annual Conference (1956) were read and

approved.

W. D. Lindquist reported for the Policy Committee. He moved that the current Presiding Officer and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Conference be made ex officio members of the Policy Committee. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

W. D. Lindquist moved that the Chairman or ranking member of the Police Committee, normally the Presiding Officer of the past year, be designated th Vice-Presiding Officer of the Conference. The motion was seconded and

unanimously approved.

F. J. Kruidenier suggested that the Conference consider the proposed revision of the constitution of the American Society of Parasitology with a view to affiliation with the American Society after adoption of the constitu Presiding Officer Ackert requested that Article VI of the proposed revision, pertaining to regional branches and affiliated organizations be read to the Conference. Article VI was read.

A. C. Walton, President-elect of the American Society of Parasitologis discussed the renovation of the constitution of the American Society of Parasitologists. He noted that, if adopted, the affiliation of regional groups or organizations would be invited.

G. F. Otto, President of the American Society of Parasitologists, note that Article VI specifies that the members of affilating groups need not all be members of the American Society but that all officers of the groups must Further, affiliate groups with 25 members of the American Society may elect a representative without note to the Council of the American Society.

Action on affiliation was deferred to the 1958 Conference.

N. D. Levine reported for the Membership Committee that there are approximately 160-170 members on the present Conference lists.

Presiding Officer Ackert reported that the memorial article to Chester

Herrick had been accepted by the Journal of Parasitology.

Dr. Ackert appointed a meeting place committee of R. M. Cable (Chairman Shugart and G. Kelly; a nominating committee of N. D. Levine (Chairman), S. I and R. M. Lewert; a program committee of R. J. Porter (Chairman), L. O. Nolf, and F. J. Kruidenier, Auditors P. Harwood and R. V. Bangham, and a Resolutions Committee M. G. Lysenko and P. Fitzgerald.

R. J. Porter explained the topography of interest to the conference.

The meeting was adjourned.

Business meeting - June 18: The meeting was called to order by Dr. Ackert at 9:15 a.m. in the Auditorium of the School of Public Health.

Dr. Porter discussed the arrangements for the tour of the nuclear

reactor which had been arranged for the members of the Conference.

N. D. Levine presented the recommendation of the nominating committee that G. R. LaRue be nominated Presiding Officer for 1958 and that F. J. Kruidenier be nominated Secretary-Treasurer for 1958-59. The nominations were seconded and unanimously adopted.

R. M. Cable reported that the meeting place committee recommended Manhattan, Kansas, Kansas State College as the site of the 1958 meetings of

the Conference. The nomination was seconded and unanimously adopted.

R. J. Porter, program committee, recommended that the Conference disci problems of the presentation of parasitology at the undergraduate level in 1958. The discussion might center around a report of the Huff committee of the National Academy of Science-National Research Council. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Auditors Bangham and Harwood reported the books of the Conference

in order.

The Treasurer's report was presented and approved.

M. G. Lysenko and P. Fitzgerald moved a vote of appreciation to the local committee for the ninth Conference (R. J. Porter, Dusseau, Hairjstrom, and van der Schalie. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously.

J. E. Ackert explained how easy it is to find Manhattan, Kansas.

A motion to adjourn was seconded and approved.

A panel-group discussion of the presentation of scientific papers was led by J. E. Ackert, N. D. Levine, R. M. Cable, G. F. Otto and P. Fitzgerald. L. O. Nolf acted as moderator.

Dear Dr. Thompson:

The Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists has voted unanimously to ask the American Society of Parasitologists to accept the Conference as an Affiliate Organization under the terms and within the restrictions of Article VI of the latter's constitution. The Conference designated its Secretary-Treasurer to present this request to the Council of the American Society of Parasitologists. It is hereby requested, on behalf of the Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists, that the Council of the American Society of Parasitologists consider and act upon this petition at its earliest convenience.

The Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists was established in 1947. It is an unincorporated organization of all interested parasitologists and students of parasitology and whose purpose is the furthering of informal discussion of research and teaching in parasitology. A yearly meeting is held each June in the very general midwestern area. There are no dues but a registration fee of fifty cents (\$0.50) is charged each registrant at each meeting.

The Conference is governed by a presiding officer, a secretary-treasurer and a policy committee composed of the above in ex officio capacity and the last five presiding officers of the Conference. The most recently retired presiding officer acts as chairman of the policy committee.

The presiding officer is elected by the membership for a period of one year to officiate at the following annual meeting, to arrange for a banquet speaker and to appoint the necessary local and ad hoc committees desired by the membership.

The secretary-treasurer is elected by the membership for a period of two years to issue the notices of meetings and prepare their agenda, to notify the newly elected presiding officers of their election and their duties, to act as general correspondent of the Conference and to disburse and act as custodian of the funds of the Conference.

Membership in the Conference is at the request of interested individuals. Voting rights are vested in members in attendance at the annual business meetings. A simple majority vote of members in attendance at the business meetings of the Conference determines the desires and policies of the Conference.
