

Report of the Secretary-Treasurer, 1959
61 Registrants

The tenth Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists was called to order by Presiding Officer G. R. LaRue at 4:10 p.m., June 16, 1958, at Kansas State College, Manhattan, Kansas.

The minutes of the ninth Annual Conference and the financial report as of June 16, 1957 were read by the Secretary-Treasurer. They were approved by the Conference.

It was moved and seconded that the Annual Midwestern Conference request affiliation with the American Society of Parasitologists.

In the ensuing discussion it was brought out that:

As an affiliate the Conference would be obligated to select its officers from its ASP members.

Membership in the Conference is limited only by the desire of interested individuals to become members.

That publication in the Journal of the American Society of Parasitologists was available to the Affiliates when paid for by the such affiliate organizations.

That "Midwestern" refers to the general location of the meetings of the Conference and does not delimit the territory of the Conference and that, in fact, no territorial limitation is described by the Conference. Membership is not so limited.

The Conference voted unanimously that the Secretary-Treasurer be directed to prepare and present a letter of application for affiliate status of the Conference in the American Society of Parasitologists.

Presiding Officer LaRue announced the Policy Committee for 1959 as G. R. LaRue, Chairman, and Drs. J. E. Ackert, W. D. Lindquist, R. M. Cable and A. C. Walton. Presiding Officer G. F. Otto and Secretary-Treasurer F. J. Kruidenier sit as ex officio members.

Presiding Officer LaRue designated the following ad hoc Committees:

Eleventh Annual Conference: Northwestern University: 80 registrars

The Eleventh Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists was called to order by Presiding Officer Dr. Gilbert F. Otto at 4 p.m. on June 15, 1959, at Northwestern University in Evanston, IL

The minutes of the Tenth Conference and the financial report as of June 15, 1959 were read. They were approved by the Conference.

The Conference was informed that:

- (1) Affiliation with the American Society of Parasitologists had been requested at the 1958 meeting of the ASP Council at Bloomington, Ind. as desired by the Tenth Conference.
- (2) Affiliation with ASP had been granted by that Council and approved by the membership of ASP.
- (3) Affiliation with ASP automatically limits the choice of Conference officers to those members who are also members of ASP.
- (4) The Annual Conference is now entitled to designate a non-voting member of the ASP Council.
- (5) Presiding Officer Otto had designated F. J. Kruidenier to represent AMCOP on the Council of ASP because the designate's name was needed by ASP prior to the Eleventh Conference.

The Conference voted to have the incoming Presiding Officer appoint its member to the Council of ASP each year. Such appointment is for the following year in order that the name of the designate shall be available to ASP prior to the scheduled June meetings of the Conference.

It was indicated by Secretary-Treasurer Kruidenier that the Conference statement of "Objectives and Organization" should be filed with ASP and that it needed revision to incorporate the provisions for the Policy Committee and for affiliation with ASP voted by the Conference since 1953.

The Conference voted that the Policy Committee revise its statement of "Objectives and Organization".
