
Dr. Glenn L. Hoffman (trematodes & Myxosporidia of fresh-water fishes)

The fifteenth Annual conference was held at the University of Minnesota, St. Paul Campus, June 24-25, 1963. Dr. Merle F. Hansen was Presiding Officer and the local arrangements were made by Dr. William J. Benrick. Approximately 90 attended the conference and there were 20 demonstrations.

Dr. Ernest J. Huggins, as chairman of the program committee, introduced the following panelists who presented their special comments on host specificity of animal parasites:

The annual banquet speaker was Dr. F. G. Wallace. Dr. Wallace discussed some interesting observations which he made while participating in the Louisiana State University Interamerican Program in Tropical Medicine. His colored slides made the talk most enjoyable.

Dr. David T. Clark was elected Presiding Officer for 1963-64, and Dr. Ernest J. Huggins was elected for a two year term as Secretary-Treasurer. The Sixteenth Annual Conference will be held at the University of Chicago, and Dr. Robert M. Lewert will be local host.

Wallace discussed recent experiences while participating in the Louisiana State University Interamerican Program in Tropical Medicine and Parasitology. His talk was most interesting and educational.

A letter from Dr. Kruidenier, as Secretary of ASP indicated that the special report from the National Society for Medical Research concerning bills in Congress written to regulate the use of experimental animals which was mailed by AMCOP motivated numerous people to write letters to the NSMR expressing their reasons for opposing the bills. Dr. Kruidenier further indicated that reimbursement for the cost of mailing the special report could be obtained.

Dr. Mantel moved that ASP pay for the expenses incurred for mailing the special report from NSMR. Motion was seconded.

Dr. Cable amended the motion to read - ASP be informed that AMCOP would accept reimbursement for mailing costs, if ASP desires making payment. Amendment seconded - Motion carried.

There was no new business.

First business meeting was adjourned at 4:45.

Nominating Committee: Chairman Wood moved that Dr. Merle Hansen be nominated for Presiding Officer. Motion seconded. Carried.


