Subj: ANNUAL REPORT

There have been two annual meetings of the regional affiliate since the last Council meeting. The 17th Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists was held at the Kellogg Gull Lake Biological Station of Michigan State University on May 28-29, 1965. Dr. Paul E. Thompson served as Presiding Officer. Dr. David T. Clark was in charge of local arrangements at the lovely setting on Gull Lake. The banquet speaker was Dr. Leon Jacobs, of the National Institutes of Health. He presented a highly informative illustrated lecture on toxoplasmosis. Dr. Milo Brandt, Chairman of the Program Committee, introduced the Saturday symposium led by graduate students, as follows: Dan A. Ostlind, (Kansas State Univ.), Glen E. Dappen, Donald Ferguson (Univ. of Nebraska), Gilbert Sanchez (Univ. of Kansas), and Richard B. Westcott (Univ. of Wisconsin). Their topics dealt with their studies in irradiation, immunity, and helminths as vectors of viruses.

Prior to the 18th Annual Conference, an attempt was made to update the mailing list by purchasing a strip list of the membership of the American Society of Parasitologists. Questionnaires were sent to ASP members in the midwest, as well as to some persons in other regions who had previously shown interest. The response was very good. Any suggestions or comments from Council regarding membership will be welcomed.

The 18th Annual Conference was held at the University of Illinois, Urbana, on June 10-11, 1966. Dr. Martin J. Ulmer served as Presiding Officer. Dr. Norman D. Levine was in charge of local arrangements. There were more than 100 registrants and an excellent number of 28 demonstrations at the traditional Friday afternoon demonstration session. This was followed by an illustrated talk on experiences of an LSU Inter-American Fellow, by E. J. Huggins; the emphasis was on Puerto Rico, in anticipation of the approaching ASP meeting in San Juan. The evening banquet lecture was given by Dr. Dominic L. DeGiusti, who shared his knowledge of the Acanthocephala drawn from long experience. Dr. J. Allan Waitz, Chairman of the Program Committee, introduced the graduate student symposium on Saturday morning. 

Dr. Paul H. Silverman was elected Presiding Officer for 1967. Dr. Frank Etges will serve as Chairman of the Program Committee. The 19th Annual Conference will be held at Iowa State University, Ames, in June 1967, with Dr. Martin J. Ulmer in charge of local arrangements.

An item of business which may be of interest to Council is a proposal from Eli Lilly and Company to initiate an award of \$200 per year to be presented to the graduate student who best demonstrates his research at the Annual Midwestern Conference. The Secretary-Treasurer introduced for discussion a proposal from Eli Lilly and Company that an award of \$200 per year be presented to the graduate student who best demonstrates his research at the annual conference. The proposal had previously been circulated by mail to all members of the Policy Committee of ~~XEM~~ AMCOP. The Committee had favored setting up the award but wanted to have it discussed by the membership at the annual meeting. It was moved by Dr. Walton, seconded by Dr. Levine that the Policy Committee set up rules to govern the award. Carried. Dr. Kelley on behalf of the Policy Committee asked for suggestions as to guide-lines. There was considerable discussion about such matters as to whether or not a point system should be established for judging demonstrations, whether the award should be announced at the Friday evening banquet or at the Saturday morning business meeting, etc. The consensus of opinion seemed to be that an awards committee should be appointed and that it should be given wide latitude to set its own rules for the first few years of the award. Moved by Dr. Levine, seconded by Dr. Cable, that the Presiding Officer, Dr. Martin Ulmer, appoint a judging committee of 3 to 5 members for 1967. Carried.

Following the business meeting, Dr. E. J. Huggins gave an illustrated talk on experiences of an LSU Inter-American Fellow, with emphasis upon Puerto Rico in anticipation of the approaching ASP meeting in San Juan.

The annual banquet was held at 6:30 PM in the Illini Union. The annual lecture was given by Dr. Dominic L. DeGiusti, of Wayne State University, in which he shared his knowledge of the Acanthocephala drawn from long experience.

Second Business Meeting - June 11, 1967

Dr. Martin Ulmer, Presiding Officer, called the meeting to order at 8:30 AM

in the auditorium of the Veterinary Medicine Building. Reports of the ad hoc committees were called for.

Nominating Committee, H. W. Manter, Chairman: The name of Dr. Paul H. Silverman was placed in nomination for the next Presiding Officer. Moved by Dr. Kruidenier, seconded by Dr. Cable, that nominations cease. Dr. Silverman elected.

Meeting Place Committee, John L. Crites, Chairman: The 19th Annual Conference will be held at Iowa State University early in June, 1967. There was no firm invitation for 1968, although on the questionnaire distributed by the Secretary, individuals from some 6 institutions had indicated an interest in hosting the meeting. The Secretary was directed to follow up some of these "tentative invitations".

Program Committee, Frank Etges, Chairman: The committee would welcome suggestions.

Resolutions Committee, Mary Hanson Pritchard, Chairman: Be it resolved that the Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists wishes to thank the University of Illinois through Professor Norman D. Levine for the hospitality and use of facilities at the College of Veterinary Medicine during the meeting of the 18th Annual Conference. And be it resolved that the Conference wishes to express its deep appreciation to Eli Lilly and Company which has generously offered to provide an award to the graduate student presenting the best demonstration at succeeding meetings of the Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists.

The membership moved adjournment of the second business meeting.

Dr. J. Allen Waitz, Chairman of the Program Committee, introduced the graduate student symposium. The following persons gave very fine presentations on parasitological techniques utilized in their research: Despommier, Dickson (Univ. of Notre Dame), Donald E. Gilbertson (Univ. of Cincinnati), Margaret Schelling, Graciela Mesa-Ruiz (Univ. of Illinois), Charles W. Dickerson, and Richard Kocan (Michigan State Univ.). The Conference was concluded with a field trip led by Dr. Norman D. Levine to the Parasitology-Micrometeorology Experimental Plot at the Veterinary Research Farm.

The Policy Committee is composed of the last five available retired Presiding Officers, plus, ex officio and without vote, the current Presiding Officer and the Secretary-Treasurer. The membership of this committee for 1966-67 is as follows: George Kelley (1962), Merle Hansen (1963), David Clark (1964), Paul Thompson (1965), Martin Ulmer (1966), and ex officio, Paul H.
