For the first time, there were co-awards, won by Mrs. Betty A. Caveny ("Developmental stages of Microphallus opacus") and Mr. Thomas P. Bonner ("The structure and formation of cuticle in Nematospiroides dubius"). Both recipients were from the University of Cincinnati. The Judging Committee was greatly impressed by the quality of all the demonstrations, making the winner difficult to select. The Judging Committee was composed of George Kelley, Tom Dunagan, and B. J. Jaskoski, Chairman.

Annual Address

Presiding Officer Manter introduced the honored speaker, Prof. Horace W. Stunkard. Prof. Stunkard received his graduate training (Ph.D., 1914) at the University of Illinois under H. B. Ward, was head of the Department of Biology at New York University for 30 years, and currently is working at the American Museum of Natural History. Prof. Stunkard has served as president of American Society of Parasitologists, and editor of the Journal of Parasitology, among other significant offices. After receiving a standing ovation, Prof. Stunkard spoke on the subject, "Life histories and systematics of parasitic flatworms", wherein he summarized over 50 years of experience and gave many opinions on the subject. This was truly a memorable address.

Annual Report to Council, American Society of Parasitologists
Washington, D.C.

The 21st Annual Midwestern Conference of Parasitologists convened on the campus of the University of Cincinnati on June 13-14, 1969. Dr. Frank Etges was in charge of local arrangements, and Dr. Harold W. Manter was Presiding Officer. There were 82 registrants.

The demonstration session consisted of 21 scheduled demonstrations and several others added. The subject matter ranged from electron microscopy, to histochemistry, to host/parasite relationships. The C. A. Herrick Award to that graduate student who best exhibits his research work had cowinners: Betty A. Caveny (Developmental stages of Microphallus opacus) and Thomas P. Bonner (The structure and formation of cuticle in Nematospiroides dubius). Eli Lilly and Company sponsor the award. The Herrick Award has tended to improve the quality of all demonstrations, making it very difficult to select a winner. The judging committee was comprised of George Kelley, Tom Dunagan, and B. J. Jaskoski, Chairman.

The annual address was given by Professor Horace W. Stunkard. Entitled "Life histories and systematics of parasitic flatworms", Professor Stunkard summarized over 50 years of experience and gave many opinions on the subject.

Thomas P. Bonner (University of Cincinnati), Clayton R. Page
(University of Cincinnati), and John E. Zapotosky (Ohio State
University). Dr. John Crites was Program Officer and presided
over the symposium.
