- 2. The officers are a Presiding Officer, whose term of office is one year or until his successor is elected (normally his term would expire with the adjournment of the annual Conference over which he presides); a Secretary-Treasurer, whose term of office is two years or until his successor is elected; a Program Officer, whose term of office is one year; and a Policy Committee composed of the last five available retired Presiding Officers plus, ex officio and without vote, the current Presiding Officer and Secretary-Treasurer. The term of office of each full member of the Policy Committee is five years, or so long as he is one of the five most recent, available Presiding Officers. The most recent past Presiding Officer available is the Chairman of the Policy Committee and the Vice Presiding Officer of the Conference.
- 3. The Presiding Officer, the Secretary-Treasurer, and the Program Officer are elected by a majority vote of those members attending a regularly scheduled business meeting of the Conference or by a majority vote of those replying to a mail ballot of the membership.
- 4. The Presiding Officer shall preside at all meetings of the Conference and shall arrange for a banquet speaker.

On the first day of a Conference he shall appoint the following committees, which shall serve until they have reported on the last day of the annual Conference: (1) Nominating Committee, (2) Committee to Recommend Future Meeting Places, (3) Committee to Suggest Program Possibilities for Future Meetings, (4) Resolutions Committee, and such other <u>ad hoc</u> committees as may be required.

He shall appoint the Conference Representative for the Council of the American Society of Parasitologists for the year following his tenure of office and serve as a member without vote of the Policy Committee.

- 5. The Secretary-Treasurer shall issue a call at least four months prior to each Conference for participants in the program for each Conference; inform the new Presiding Officer of his duties and the members of the Policy Committee of their tenure and Secretary of the American Society of Parasitology within three weeks after the annual election; serve as member without vote and Secretary of the Policy Committee; and supervise all funds of the Conference.
- 6. The Program Officer shall be responsible for the general format of the Conference and for arranging suitable facilities. It shall also be his responsibility to serve as chairman of the special committee to determine the registration fee for the Conference. The format of the Conference may vary, but should include both a demonstration session open to all members and a session of contributed papers limited to general format of the general format of the conference may vary, but should include both a demonstration session open to all members and a session of contributed papers limited to general format of the conference may vary, but should include both a demonstration session open to all members and a session of contributed papers.
- 7. The Policy Committee shall determine by majority vote all matters of procedure and policy pertaining to the Conference upon which decision must be reached between consecutive Conferences, as well as all matters referred specifically to it by the membership. Such a vote may be requested by any member of the Conference, but must be directed through the Secretary-Treasurer. The Chairman of the Policy Committee shall request the approval of the membership for all decisions of the Committee at the earliest subsequent business meeting of the Conference.

THE ANNUAL MIDWESTERN CONFERENCE OF PARASITOLOGISTS

Objectives and Organization

A restatement to incorporate changes approved in 1974. Earlier statements had been approved in 1948, 1953, 1971, 1972, and 1973.

Name

The organization shall be known as the ANNUAL MIDWESTERN CONFERENCE OF PARASITOLOGISTS, hereinafter referred to as the Conference.

Affiliation

The Conference is an affiliate of the American Society of Parasitologists

Objectives

The Conference is a gathering of parasitologists and students of parasitology for the purpose of informal discussion of research and teaching in parasitology and the furthering of the best interests of the discipline of parasitology.

Members

The Conference is open to all interested persons regardless of place of work, residence, or affiliation in other recognized societies.

Dues

No regular dues are collected, but a registration fee is charged members during registration at annual conferences. The amount of this fee will be decided for each Conference by a committee composed of the Presiding Officer, the Secretary-Treasurer, and the Program Officer, who is to serve as its chairman.

Meetings

The Conference is held in the general midwestern area in mid-June, unless otherwise specified by a majority vote of the previous Conference or a majority vote of those listed members replying by mail ballot.

Bylaws

1. A simple majority vote of members in attendance at regularly scheduled business meetings of the Conference shall determine the policies of the Conference.

MINUTES OF THE 26th ANNUAL MIDWESTERN CONFERENCE OF PARASITOLOGISTS

June 14-15, 1974 Ann Arbor, Michigan

A tour of the labs where numerous strains of snails and trematode cycles are industriously maintained was the high-light of the morning of June 14.

Twenty-four demonstrations were on display in C. C. Little Hall. Topics ranged from electron microscopy to culture methods, and from flukes to acari.

First business meeting: The meeting was called to order at 4:05 p.m. by Presiding Officer Donald Ameel, and the minutes of the 25th meeting were approved. Martin Ulmer gave the report of the ad hoc Committee to Revise the Bylaws, an item that had been referred from the 25th AMCOP. The report was adopted, and the changes were incorporated into the Bylaws. A motion to specifically include student papers as eligible for an award of recognition was tabled and referred to Policy Committee, which is to report to the 27th AMCOP.

There was no new business. After some announcements by Presiding Officer Ameel, the meeting was adjourned at 4:35.

Addresses: After dinner, Dr. H. van der Schalie related interesting aspects of parasitology at U. of Michigan, past, present, and future. It included comments on such luminaries as Cort, LaRue, and Woodhead. This was followed by an ebullient address by Martin Ulmer ("Snails, Swamps and Swimmer's Itch"), in which he described several years' observations at Lakeside Lab in Iowa.

C. A. Herrick Award: This \$200 award, supported by Eli Lilly & Company, was split between Darrel Prechel (Western Illinois) and Philip LoVerde (Michigan) for excellence in demonstrating their research. Prechel's demonstration was titled "Miracidial Behavior of Megalodiscus temperatus", and LoVerde's three demonstrations were "Chromosomes of Some Trematodes", "Systematic and Parasitological Studies on the Polyploid Subgenus Bulinus s.s.", and "Life History of Schistosoma by S.E.M." The judging committee consisted of Cain, Etges, and Jaskoski (chr).

2nd business meeting: The meeting was called to order at 9:10 a.m., after breaking fast on coffee and rolls. The Resolutions Committee (Shoemaker and Vaughn) thanked those at the University of Michigan, specifically Drs. Blankespoor, van der Schalie, Berry, and Gans for their roles in making AMCOP welcome and successful. Eli Lilly was recognized for its support of the

Herrick Award, and Parke-Davis for its financial support of the social hour. (The Secretary-Treasurer sent the appropriate letters of appreciation.)

The <u>Nominations Committee</u> (Cable, Shumard) placed the following slate in nomination: Presiding Officer, William Bemrick; Program Officer, Martin Ulmer. The slate was elected by acclamation.

The <u>Site Selection Committee</u> (McDougal and Duwe) presented the following invitations for future AMCOP meetings: 1975, Iowa State; 1976, Nebraska; 1977, Kansas State; 1978, Eli Lilly. The list was approved.

The Auditing Committee (LoVerde and Bemrick) reported the Treasurer's books to be in order, after a correction (\$2.23) was made.

Having no new business, the meeting adjourned to hear the 2 scheduled papers on reproduction of Schistosoma japonicum and on larval interaction of 2 species of $\frac{Paragonimus}{Paragonimus}$ in Oncomelania.

The Policy Committee (Ameel, Greve, Jaskoski, Crites, Ulmer, Etges, Shumard, chr.) met to discuss the issue referred to it, viz. an award of recognition for student papers. The report will be given at the Iowa State meeting.


